Calvin CRC Announcements for March 31, 2019

WORSHIP Today, 10 AM and 5 PM

Morning worship: We welcome Olivia Jean Dierlam into the body of Christ through the sacrament of baptism. The Calvin College Capella, under the direction of Pearl Shangkuan, leads us in worship. Rev. Rebecca Jordan Heys preaches from Luke 15:11-32, "The Father Ran," and the offering is for 70 X 7.

70 X 7 provides services to offenders, victims, and their families. Services include pastoral counseling, workshops, and support groups for women and children, transportation for children visiting parents in prison, educational seminars, client advocacy, re-entry mentoring, and the promotion of religious programming in Michigan prisons. One of 70 X 7's programs, Take Charge (an educational program for women), takes place at Calvin Church every Thursday morning, virtually year-round.

Evening worship: We welcome the congregations of Woodlawn and Plymouth Heights CRCs to join us here at Calvin Church. Rev. Jack Roeda preaches from Micah 6:1-8 and Matthew 5:1-11, "What Does the Lord Require of Us?" The offering is for Wedgwood Christian Services.

Wedgwood provides numerous services for adolescents and their families, including both inpatient and outpatient counseling, alternatives in education for high-risk kids, and substance abuse treatment and prevention services.

Staff notes: Pastor Rebecca will be on vacation April 1-8. If you desire pastoral care during that time, contact Pastor Brad, Pastor Jake, your district Elder, or the church office.

WORSHIP Next Sunday, April 7

Morning worship: Rev. Brad Zwiers will preach from Isaiah 43:16-21. We will sing hymns that were requested by the congregation, and the offering will be for the Micah Center.

The Micah Center holds first and third Tuesday meetings where people can learn about and become involved in social justice issues. In 2013, Calvin Church became one of about forty five supporting churches of the Micah Center.

Evening worship: Rev. Charles Fullmer will preach from Philippians 3:2-14. Rev. Fullmer is a minister in the United Methodist Church and an active participant in the life of Calvin Church. The offering will be for Baxter Community Center.

Baxter Community Center helps individuals and families meet their emotional, physical, and spiritual needs so they can create a future rooted in hope. Its services include a child development center, a health clinic, a mentoring program, a food and clothing pantry, financial counseling, and nutritional programs.
