remembrance of me.” For whenever we eat this bread and drink this cup,
we proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.

Therefore we proclaim our faith as signed and sealed in this sacrament:

Christ has died!

Christ is risen!

Christ will come again!

Lord, our God, send your Holy Spirit so that this bread and cup may be for us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. May we and all your saints be united with Christ and remain faithful in hope and love. Gather your whole church, O Lord, into the glory of your kingdom.

In Worship:

- Our worship proceeds unannounced and follows the printed liturgy.
- Chancel Banner: As the empty tomb revealed to Mary Magdalene and the other Mary that Christ had won for us the victory over death, so the bursting life-form radiates from a void to symbolize the dynamic and everlasting life of the redeemed. The metallic stitchery and satin trapunto express the concept of glory. The white background, which symbolizes purity, is borrowed from our medieval art heritage.

- Adult coloring pages are on the TRIP table in the Narthex.
- Our facility is equipped with the Loop hearing system.
