Calvin CRC Announcements for September 22, 2019

WORSHIP Today, 10 AM and 5 PM

Morning worship: Rev. Rebecca Jordan Heys preaches from Luke 16:1-13, “Serving Mammon.” Stephanie Wiltse leads us in ministry of music.

The Worship Committee has been soliciting song suggestions from our young people to use in our worship services. This morning we will be singing “Jesus Loves Me,” #709, which was requested by Ella Jansen and Arie TerBeek.

Evening worship: We welcome Rev. Dr. Won Lee to lead our time of worship. He preaches from Genesis 12:1-4 and Acts 20:17-24, “Not Knowing, But Going.” We celebrate the sacrament of the Lord’s Supper, and the offering is for Grand Rapids Christian Schools tuition support.

WORSHIP Next Sunday, September 29

Morning worship: We will commission our musicians for their leadership in our worship this coming year on this Music Dedication Sunday. Rev. Rebecca Jordan Heys will preach from Psalm 150, “Everything That Breathes,” and the offering will be for the Holland Home Foundation.

Evening worship: Rev. Brad Zwiers will preach from Luke 16:19-31, “It Takes Some Convincing.” The offering will be for ICCF (Inner-City Christian Federation).

COUNCIL NEWS

The Council heard reports from the pastors on current and upcoming plans for ministry that will engage the congregation and challenge us in our faith formation. These include a sermon series on the Apostles’ Creed, Christmas/Advent programs, and a series of faith formation workshops.

The report from our Treasurer was positive. If Ministry Fund offerings follow the typical pattern from now to year-end, we should meet our budget projections.

The Council continues to study and discuss the recommendations of the Planning and Vision Committee report. Many of the report’s recommendations have already been put into practice. The Council is grateful to the committee for providing a road map as we continue to challenge ourselves in understanding our mission.

The Council learned that Global Gifts has had to sever its legal relationship with Calvin Church, based on a ruling from the State of Michigan. We will continue to support Global Gifts as a community care cause and through our volunteers as it now operates as a non-profit corporation.

A motion was approved to add an annual grant of \$500 per child per year in support of those families who enroll their children in K-12 Christian schools. Tuition support is tangible evidence of our congregation’s baptismal vows to support the faith formation of our youth. This motion will need to be approved by the congregation at our December meeting. If approved, it will go into effect for the 2020-21 school year.

Finally, the Council approved a motion to permit All One Body to hold a November 21 educational meeting in the Fellowship Hall.

Today—**ADULT EDUCATION:** Why We Listen to Sermons

Presenter: Rev. Scott Hoezee. In his recent book, *Why We Listen to Sermons*, Scott Hoezee tackles two related questions: why has preaching always been so important in the church and how can ordinary listeners get better at evaluating the sermons they hear so as to provide meaningful feedback to their pastors? Rev. Hoezee will summarize key sections of his book, discuss how to become better sermon listeners, and take questions stemming from these topics.

Presenter: Miriam Pederson. This presentation focuses on the capacity of poetry to console, inspire, and elevate its readers through distilled and surprising language. Dr. Jonathan Dudley is a Calvin College graduate in biology, with an MA in ethics from Yale University Divinity School, and an MD from Johns Hopkins School of Medicine.
