*Call to Confession*

*God's Word tells us that if we confess our sins, the resurrected Jesus, who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. Let's go before our risen Lord in prayer.*

*Prayer of Confession*

Bring new life where we are worn and tired;  
new love where we have turned hard-hearted;  
forgiveness where we feel hurt and where we have wounded;  
and the joy and freedom of your Holy Spirit where  
we are prisoners of ourselves.*

*Lord, forgive us and raise us from sin,  
so that we may be your faithful people,  
following the way of our Lord Jesus Christ,  
who rules the world and is head of the church. Amen.*

*Assurance of Pardon*

*Hear the good news: in Jesus Christ the risen Lord of life, our sins have been forgiven. We are cleansed, we are forgiven, and we are free! Amen.*
