*Call to Confession*

*We know that nothing is able to separate us  
from the love of God in Jesus Christ.*

*So, in that freedom, let’s confess our sin before the Triune God.*

*Prayer of Confession*

*God of everlasting love,  
we confess that we have been unfaithful  
to our covenant with you and with one another.  
We have worshiped other gods: money, power, greed, and convenience.  
We have served our own self-interest  
instead of serving only you and your people.  
We have not loved our neighbor as you have commanded,  
nor have we rightly loved ourselves.  
Forgive us gracious God,  
and bring us back into the fullness  
of our covenant with you and one another.  
Through Christ, our Lord. Amen.*

*Assurance of Pardon*

*Hear the good news: Christ died for us while we were yet sinners. In the name of Jesus Christ, we are forgiven! And we are free to live in the love of God. Amen!*

Before the video prayer, you may wish to speak or journal your own prayers, and then join your prayers to others as you start the video again.

*Prayer of Thanksgiving and Intercession, concluding with the Lord's Prayer:*

***Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name.  
Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.  
Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.  
For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.***






