Prelude/Call to Worship: Praise to the Lord, the Almighty [#575]—Jan Bender

Greeting:

*Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.
Amen.*

Call to Confession:

God searches our hearts.

God knows our thoughts.

God knows our sins against God and people.

God also loves us deeply and promises forgiveness if we confess our sins to God.

In this assurance, let us come before God and confess our sins together.

Prayer of Confession:

Holy God,

We often try to hide our sins,

we'd rather keep them in the dark,

pretending that they don't exist,

trying to fool ourselves and others,

maintaining a good image in front of others.

But we cannot hide them from you.

You see what is hidden.

Even darkness is not dark to you.

Your Holy Spirit makes known to us what we try to hide.

*Convict us and draw us back to you.
We confess our sins before you.
Please have mercy on us and forgive us.
We come to you in the name of our Savior, Jesus Christ.
Amen.*

*Words of Assurance:
People of God, hear the good news!
God knows us intimately.
God loves us deeply - enough to die for us.
We are more precious to God than many sparrows.
Through Jesus Christ, we are forgiven!
Thanks be to God!*

Before the video prayer, you may wish to speak or journal your own prayers, and then join your prayers to others as you start the video again.

Prayer of Thanksgiving and Intercession, concluding with the Lord's Prayer:

***Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.
Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.***
