Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper, a gracious gift that God provides to Christ's body, the church. All who have been baptized into Christ and who desire to honor him with grateful and obedient living are invited to participate in this sacrament, discerning that this bread and cup are signs and seals of God's love for us and that we who participate are members of Christ's body.

*Call to Confession*

*The proof of God's amazing love is this:*

*While we were sinners, Christ died for us.*

*Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness,*  
*so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.*

*Trusting in God's faithfulness and compassion,*  
*let us confess our sin before God and one another.*

*Prayer of Confession (from Psalm 25)*

***Be mindful of your mercy, O Lord, and of your steadfast love,  
for they have been from of old.***

***Do not remember the sins of my youth or my transgressions;  
according to your steadfast love remember me,  
for your goodness' sake, O Lord.***

***For your name's sake, O Lord, pardon my guilt, for it is great.***

***Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted.***

***Relieve the troubles of my heart, and bring me out of my distress.***

***Consider my affliction and my trouble, and forgive all my sins.***

***Amen.***

*Assurance of Pardon (from Psalm 25)*

*Good and upright is the Lord; therefore he instructs sinners in the way.*

*He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way.*

*All the paths of the Lord are steadfast love and faithfulness,  
for those who keep his covenant and his decrees.*

*The steadfast love and faithfulness of the Lord show themselves in the cross of Jesus Christ.*

*Dear friends, I declare to you in the name of Jesus and by the power of the cross, your sins are forgiven. Thanks be to God!*

Before the video prayer, you may wish to speak or journal your own prayers, and then join your prayers to others as you start the video again.

*Prayer of Thanksgiving and Intercession, concluding with the Lord's Prayer:*

***Our Father in heaven,***

***hallowed be your name.***

***Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.***

***Give us this day our daily bread.***

***And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.***

***Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.***

***For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.***

*Prayer of Application*

*The Lord's Supper*

*According to Luke, when our risen Lord was at table with his disciples, he took the bread, and blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him. Holy God, we praise you. Let the heavens be joyful, and the earth be glad. We bless you for creating the whole world, for your promises to your people Israel, and for Jesus Christ in whom your fullness dwells.*

*With thanksgiving we take this bread and this cup and proclaim the death and resurrection of our Lord. Receive our sacrifice of praise. Pour out your Holy Spirit upon us that this meal may be a communion in the body and blood of our Lord. Make us one with Christ and with all who share this feast. Unite us in faith, encourage us with hope, inspire us to love, that we may serve as your faithful disciples until we feast at your table in glory. We praise you, eternal God, through Christ your Word made flesh, in the holy and life-giving Spirit, now and forever. Amen.*

***(You may prepare the elements, breaking the bread and pouring the cup, during the following words of institution.)***

*The Lord Jesus, on the night of his arrest, took bread, and after giving thanks to God, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.*

*In the same way he took the cup, saying: This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood, shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me. Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the saving death of the risen Lord, until he comes.*

***(Each worshiper eats the bread, saying to oneself or to one another, "The body of Christ for you. Each worshiper drinks from the cup, saying to oneself or to one another, "The blood of Christ for you.")***

*Let us pray: We thank you, O God, that through Word and Sacrament you have given us your Son, who is the true bread from heaven and food of eternal life. So strengthen us in your service that our daily living may show our thanks, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

*Benediction*

*The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you. The Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace.*
