Call to Confession:

Prayer of Confession:

Almighty and loving God,

we confess that we put our trust in other gods.

We honor these gods alongside of you
and in place of you.

We are unfaithful in our relationship with you.

We are sorry.

By the Holy Spirit's power,

help us to truly love you,

the only true God.

**May we trust only in you.
May we look to you for every good thing,
humbly and patiently.
May we love, fear, and honour you
with all our hearts.
In Jesus' name, Amen.**

People loved by God, hear the good news!
There is nothing that can separate us from God's gracious, steadfast love.
In Jesus Christ, we are forgiven. Amen!*

Before the video prayer, you may wish to speak or journal your own prayers, and then join your prayers to others as you start the video again.
