COUNCIL NEWS

There is a "Coffee with the Council President" TODAY, at 11:30 AM in the Fellowship Hall to keep our congregation informed on next steps and for our elders and deacons to hear questions and comments.

The Council has scheduled a brief **Congregational Meeting** after the worship service on Sunday, June 22. The sole purpose of this meeting is to approve a change in our Articles of Incorporation. It is a legal requirement that when a church changes its denominational affiliation new Articles of Incorporation must be filed with the State of Michigan. The only substantial changes in the new Articles of Incorporation pertain to the deletion of references to the CRCNA. Any change in Articles of Incorporation must be approved by a 2/3rds majority of the congregation. The proposed Articles of Incorporation are posted for your preview on the Bulletin Board in the Atrium. Copies are also available on TRIP table in the Narthex or ask for an emailed copy from the church office. If you have any questions, please contact Philip De Jonge or Peter Kok.
