- Our Easter banner represents our joy in our Lord's resurrection. The purple conveys the reality of Christ's royalty; the blackness, symbolic of his death, moves from the outside easing into light, symbolizing life out of death. It is a promise fulfilled, giving us reason for hope in the truth of eternal life.
- Large-print resources are available at the Information Desk.
- Our facility is equipped with the Loop hearing system.



For Children:

- Ages 0-2: Infant and toddler nurseries are available.
- Preschool: The Little Children (TLC) gathers in the nursery prior to the morning worship.
