COUNCIL NEWS

Since returning to evening worship after Covid, regular services have been held the first (singing and prayer time) and third (communion) Sundays of the month, with encouragement to the congregation to have small group meetings on other weeks and a time to gather for a meal on any fifth Sundays. The Worship Committee has been monitoring this format and has come to the conclusion that the first and third Sunday services are not a wise use of our resources because of low attendance. The committee recommended to the elders that the current format be replaced by occasional special evening services instead, and the elders, with some regret, approved that plan. Beginning in January, there will be no more regular evening services on the first and third Sundays.

Jim Workman (district 3) moved out of ICU to a general room where they will continue to work to control his infection. Please pray for continued healing!

Peter Kok (district 3) is progressing well following his recent surgery. However, he had something of a setback last week with a new infection, and he is on a new antibiotic.
