Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. Lent is the forty-day period (excluding Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to Easter (this year, February 14 – March 31), during which we recall the suffering and passion of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

The aim of Ash Wednesday worship is threefold: to meditate on our mortality, sinfulness, and need of a savior; to renew our commitment to daily repentance; and to remember with confidence and gratitude Christ's conquering of death and sin. Ash Wednesday worship, then, is filled with gospel truth. It is a witness to the power and beauty of our union with Christ and to the daily dying and rising with Christ that this entails.

The imposition of ashes has a long history in biblical and church traditions. In Scripture ashes or dust symbolize frailty or death (Genesis 18:27), sadness or mourning (Esther 4:3), judgment (Lamentations 3:16), and repentance (Jonah 3:6). Some traditions also have considered ash a purifying or cleansing agent. All these images are caught up in the church's use of ashes as a symbol appropriate for Lent.

Prayer of Application

Call to Confession and Litany of Penitence

Leader: The season of Lent calls us again to follow Jesus in humility and trust. I invite you, therefore, to the observance of a Holy Lent, by taking time to say you are sorry to God for things you have done that are wrong, by spending time in prayer and reading the Bible. We will begin Lent by repenting and telling God we are sorry. We will also receive a sign of ashes to remind us that we will all die one day and that our lives are a gift from God.

Let us now confess our sin before the Lord.

All: Most holy and merciful Father, we confess to you and to one another that we have sinned against you—in what we have thought, in what we have said, and in what we have done. And it is our own fault.

We have not loved you with our whole heart.

We have not loved those near to us.

We have not forgiven others, as you have forgiven us;

we hold grudges against other people.

Forgive us, merciful God.

We have not served other people the way Jesus served us. We ignore those in need, those around the world who are hungry, and those who suffer.

Forgive us, merciful God.

We are angry when we don't get our way. We are not happy with what we have, and we want what other people have. We are greedy.

Forgive us, merciful God.

We don't pray as we should; we are lazy. Worshiping you is not as important to us as other things are; we have not told other people about you.

Forgive us, merciful God.

Restore us, good Lord, and do not be angry with us.

Forgive us, merciful God.

Accomplish in us your good works, that your will may be done on earth as it is in heaven. **Forgive us, merciful God.**

- The Litany of Penitence is adapted from *The Worship Sourcebook*.
- The black dominating our Lenten banner symbolizes the death of our Lord, the red expresses Christ's suffering, and the branch is a symbol of his crown of thorns. These symbols are not meant to be concerned only with death and suffering. The thorny branch is white and flowering to indicate that from suffering triumph will come, and the red orb symbolizes Christ's victory. Just as the sun illumines, quickens, and comforts, so Christ as the "Sun of Righteousness" gives new life to his own.
